This is a pamphlet written by Brigadier J.W. O'Brien, DSO, ED in 1952. He was nicknamed the 'boy brigadier' and among his distinguised achievements in the Second World War were the command of the 2/5th Field Regiment and the development of the Short 25-pounder gun. In 1946 he was appointed Leader of the Scientific Mission to Japan. Though many non-Americans found it difficult to work with MacArthur's headquarters, O'Brien had an excellent relationship there, principally because he had, it is said, saved

MacArthur's son from drowning.
